Goals

- Be used by the Lord to convey the Truth to campers through words and actions
- Adequately and efficiently convey the Still Water Statement of Faith through an honest and clear and age appropriate explanation of the Gospel

Chain of Communication

- Report to the Program Director and collaborate with him regarding Chalk Talk needs (slides, scripture, special music, technology needs)

Pre-camp Responsibilities

- Prepare chalk talks (20 min max each) with the following information/progression/thoughts in mind for greatest impact
 - First and foremost the speaker should operate with the idea that there are kids at camp that have never heard of God or His son Jesus. Our biggest and most important goal is to introduce them to Him and what He has done for them (Gospel). The talks should then progress from an introduction of God to Jesus to sin/need followed by cross, resurrection and redemption.
 - Remember our goal as a ministry is to introduce these students to Christ. We must teach them who Christ is and why we need Him. Try to build each talk to achieve this progress.
 - We understand as a ministry that there are students in the crowd that may have heard this message multiple times. In no way does this take away from the power of the Gospel, but however please keep them in mind and prepare/offer challenges for those who may already be walking with Jesus.
- Provide an outline and cabin questions for each talk to Director of Staffing no later than 2 weeks prior to camp.
- Be present for necessary staff training.
- Prepare yourself spiritually, mentally, and physically prior to coming out to camp

Pre-Game Responsibilities (Saturday and Sunday Training)

- Meet with Program Director and Camp Director
- Familiarize yourself with schedule to understand when, where, and what you will need to be doing at what time.

Camp Responsibilities

- Be present at the staff devotionals (bible study) in the mornings.
- Be visible throughout the day's activities so campers can see you and get to know you. (ie. Game activities, sports training, eat with campers, etc.) More familiarity = more effectiveness.
- Meet with Tech Dir. and Worship Team for Sound Check **before each Chalk Talk**
- Communicate to Tribal Leader Coordinator any specifics you would like to see happen during camper devotionals after Chalk Talk.
- Check with TLC to see if you are needed in War Room conversation.
- Be available and willing to serve in areas of need during camp.

Post Camp Responsibilities

- Assist with the break down and clean up of camp

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
